Water Quality Division Responsibilities:

Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) Review (Erosion and Sediment Control Review)

SWPPP Inspection (Erosion and Sediment Control Inspection)

Inspection/Enforcement Procedures:

Pre-Construction Meeting: Initial on-site meeting to discuss SWPPP elements from the construction plans and expectations for the project

At Project Start: Complete Inspection, Give One Week for Compliance, Complete Inspection, Fine \$100 after second week of non-compliance

After Project Start: Complete Inspection, Give One Week for Compliance, Fine \$100 if not complete

Fines Escalate to \$250, \$500, \$1,000, \$1,500 on weekly basis for each week of non-compliance

Discuss Stop Work Order once fines reach \$1,500 level

Weekly to monthly inspection schedules based on the number of projects, compliance status, etc.

Data:

2021: 70-75 active sites, 1125 inspections, 365 failures, 761 passes, \$32,850 in fees

2022: 70-75 active sites, 469 inspections, 154 failures, 315 passes, \$10,900 in fees to date

Priorities:

Keeping sediment on site, sediment basins, sediment traps, stabilization, mud tracking on main streets



## June 20, 2022 - Council Work Session Engineering Notes

### Engineering Division Responsibilities:

Inspection of infrastructure within existing city R/W and storm sewer, sanitary sewer, perimeter paths, and roadways that will become public. Common area sidewalks and curb ramps are also inspected.

### Inspection/Enforcement Procedures:

- Pre-Construction Meeting conducted prior to issuance of Subdivision Improvement Permit (SIP)
- Expectations and communication chain during construction is established between inspector, developer and contractor.
- **Performance Bond** for work in existing R/W issued by developer prior to receiving SIP.
  - The penalty is executing a performance bond. Due to non-compliance of proper construction in existing R/W.
  - Developer will usually perform the correction, so the performance Bond is not executed.
- Inspector duty examples as it pertains to:
  - Storm Sewer
    - Pipe construction, backfill material, structure flowline.
    - Developer/contractor request final inspection of storm sewer.
    - Punch list generated from final storm sewer inspection.
      - Punch list sent to developer and contractor
      - Inspection to verify punch lists addressed
    - **3-year maintenance bond issued**
      - Near the end of the 3-year maintenance bond,
      - Grade, Buried structures, leaking structures , interiors of structures inspected.
      - Punch list created from final storm inspection
        - Punch sent to developer to address or verify
        - Inspection to verify punch lists addressed
  - Sanitary
    - Pipe construction, backfill material, structure flowline.

- Developer/contractor request final inspection of Sanitary Sewer main.
- Punch list generated from final sanitary sewer inspection and final testing
  - Punch list sent to developer and contractor
  - Inspection to verify punch lists addressed
- Sanitary release letter to connect into existing Main issued following confirmation of punch-list and final testing
- No Maintenance Bond Period
  - Developer Owns Sanitary lines for 3 years prior to transfer of ownership from Developer to City
- Roadway (existing R/W future public roads)
  - Subgrade – Proof roll after cement stabilization
    - Defective spots address by developer contractor and fix verified.
  - Underdrain – Verify installation
  - Curb
    - Verify conforms with standards, alignment, integrity (i.e., damage)
    - At ADA ramp locations of curb, verify ADA compliance of curb and gutter
  - Asphalt – Verify pavement section during asphalt placement
  - Punch list prior to placing Asphalt final surface.
    - Locate and mark damaged curb.
    - Compromised previously placed asphalt (IE unraveling or damaged areas)
- Common area and perimeter pedestrian walking areas.
  - Subgrade, proof roll prior to placement of HMA walks.
  - ADA conformance of ramps at perimeter walks and common areas.
- Following placement of HMA surface – Verify RPMs, Monumentation, pavement markings installed.
- After all inspections completed.
  - Record drawings (as-builts) required by developer.
  - Maintenance Bonds submitted by developer.
  - Developer request release of Performance Bond.
  - 3-year **Maintenance Bond** - At near end of the 3-year period, the subdivision is rechecked per items above.
- Examples of issues needing resolution.
  - Legacy at Hunters Run - They were required to mill asphalt not to correct grade. Asphalt wedge and level to make corrections of asphalt grades.
  - Estes Park - R/W work not done for over 2 years

1. Uncontained trash and debris on site.
2. Failure to post a lot sign.
3. Failing or incomplete erosion control.
4. Damaged trusses.
5. Overcut studs.
6. Fire blocking issues.
7. Stair and riser inconsistencies.
8. Box fill count mainly in kitchens and smoke detectors.
9. Anchor bolt spacing.
10. Incomplete construction.

## RESIDENTIAL BUILDING PERMIT RELEASE POLICY

### Full Section Release Requirements

When items 1 – 4 are complete, contact the project Planner and the Engineering Inspector to schedule an inspection. A section cannot be released for building permits until inspections have been completed and all items below are addressed.

1. Internal streets – Pass proof roll on lime stabilized subgrade and stone, curb, base, and binder installed within entire section. (E)
2. Street name signs/blades installed with accurate street names per recorded Secondary Plat. (PZ)
3. All lot signs with lot numbers and addresses posted. (PZ)
4. All regulatory signs installed (i.e., speed limit, stop signs). (PZ)
5. LOMR-F application submitted to FEMA and Record Drawings (as-builts) submitted for floodplain fill and/or compensatory storage areas.
6. 'Fire Protection' or 'In-Service' release letter on water company letterhead. Stortz connection required. (E)
7. Digital copy of recorded secondary plat submitted. (PZ)
8. Items below either completed or Performance Bond submitted (125% of approved cost estimate).
  - a. Entrance accel/decel/passing blister, etc. (including asphalt surface, pavement markings, etc.). (E)
  - b. Storm sewer – Inspection and punch list completed. (E)
  - c. Sanitary sewer main – Inspection and punch list completed (Fishers sanitary jurisdiction). (E)
  - d. Barricades at stub streets. (E)
  - e. Entrance streetlights (at thoroughfare). (PZ)
  - f. Internal streetlights. (PZ)
  - g. Pond safety signs. (PZ)
  - h. Common Area landscaping. (PZ)
  - i. Common Area sidewalks/paths. (PZ)
  - j. Perimeter/Thoroughfare paths/sidewalks. (PZ)
  - k. Asphalt surface, pavement markings, hydrant markers, monumentation. **\*\*\*Performance Bond ONLY\*\*\*** – Surface to be placed at the time the section is 75% built-out, but no more than one (1) winter season (November – March). (E)

### Closeout – Subdivision Improvement Permit (SIP) & Bonds

All work permitted under the Subdivision Improvement Permit (SIP) shall be completed within 24 months from the date of issuance.

- Applicable Maintenance Bonds submitted: Common Area sidewalk/path, perimeter path/sidewalk, stone, base, binder, curb, storm sewer, and sanitary main (Fishers sanitary jurisdiction). **Maintenance Bonds shall be a three (3) year duration and 20% of construction costs.** Maintenance Bond activation date is to be set at the time of submittal. Applicable Performance Bonds will be released upon receipt of Maintenance Bonds. (E)
- *Erosion Control Performance Bond* to be released after Public Works approval of site stabilization, per erosion control/SWPPP plan. When complete, contact the Public Works Inspector for final inspection. (PW)
- *BMP Performance Bond* to be released after '*Final Approval*' of site Record Drawings issued by Engineering Dept. (PW)
- All other Performance Bonds to be released when work is complete and accepted by the City. Contact the Project Planner or Engineering Inspector for inspection. (E or PZ)
- '*Final Approval*' of site Record Drawings issued by Engineering Dept. (E)
- SWPPP Notice of Termination (NOT) to be signed-off by Public Works/Stormwater when site meets stabilization, infrastructure installation, and temporary controls removal requirements. Contact Public Works Inspector for an inspection. (PW)
- Contact Engineering Inspector **three (3) months** prior to the Maintenance Bond expiration date for inspection. Any repairs to be completed prior to the expiration date. (E)

## Fishers Health Department Update 6/20/2022

### COVID-19 Updates:

#### Vaccines & Testing:

- FDA panel recommended Pfizer and Moderna COVID-19 vaccines for children six months to five years of age. CDC ACIP to decide authorization June 17 and June 18. Availability as early as next week. If approved, Moderna vaccine would be available for six months to five years of age and Pfizer six months to four years of age. We have staffed up in anticipation of increased demand. Awaiting vaccine delivery from Indiana Department of Health (IDOH).
- Current weekly vaccine and testing demand ~225 and ~250, respectively. Testing is by appointment only. The IDOH's testing support ends on June 30, 2022. Will contract with LabCorp for FHD public health clinic laboratory services, including COVID-19 to continue PCR testing after IDOH support ends.
- Estimated vaccination uptake for residents five years and older: 91.1% first dose and 86.5% fully vaccinated.

#### COVID Community Rates:

- Reported cases decreasing in Fishers with CDC COVID-19 Community Level in 'Low' category. Brief period end of May where reported cases topped 200 per 100,000 residents during 7-day period, which pushed CDC level to 'Medium'.
- Guidance for individual and community level protection available on FHD website. Current and emerging variants unlikely to have major impact on our community due to high vaccination coverage and emerging evidence new variants are not leading to increased severity in disease.

- FEMA reimbursement received to date is just under \$6 million.
- Further reimbursement requests outstanding.

### **Community Health Assessment:**

- Phase 1 report from qualitative findings available online - <https://www.fishers.in.us/DocumentCenter/View/30293/Fishers-Health-Department---2022-Phase-1-CHA-Report?bidId=>
- Phase 2 secondary data analysis: preliminary findings from emergency medical services and emergency room presentation data indicate health disparities exist for certain populations and conditions. Drafting phase 2 this and next month.

### **Core Health Services:**

- Non-COVID-19 vaccines available by appointment only during all clinic hours. Uptake for vaccines steadily increasing. IDOH grants focused on promoting immunizations in collaboration with area schools – multiple ‘catch-up’ vaccination events for school-aged children schedule with HSE this summer. Working with other area schools to provide on-site vaccinations to bring children up to date on immunizations.
- Communicable disease investigations: observing increase in latent tuberculosis cases compared to previous years. LTBI is non-infectious and requires short-term pharmaceutical treatment to reduce risk for becoming active tuberculosis.

### **Health education:**

- Community courses offered throughout summer include: QPR, Youth Mental Health First Aid Training, Narcan administration and ServSafe training. Working with area schools and organizations to further create additional training opportunities.
- FHD, Fishers Parks and Community Health Network collaboration on monthly “Walk About Health” series ongoing throughout summer. Next event June 26.

### **Stigma-Free Fishers:**

- Started Caregiver Support Group, 2<sup>nd</sup> Tuesday of every month, 5-6pm in Pavilion.
- CDC associate working on mental health needs assessment.
- Local, state, and nation-wide resource guide developed by associate. To be published online this summer.

### **Inspections & Environmental Health:**

- Busy season for water/pool inspections. Food inspectors attending national conference on FDA standards via grant funding.
- Receiving twice-weekly COVID-19 wastewater surveillance data from CDC wastewater testing program. Plan to incorporate results into online COVID-19 data and guidance for residents.

### **Emergency Preparedness:**

- Vantage Point Consulting has conducted online surveys and in-person focus groups with City government and area stakeholders. Preliminary findings in draft.

### **Grants and Funding:**
