

DRIVE FISHERS

106TH STREET INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

Drive Fishers is the City of Fishers' initiative to increase travel efficiency, improve connectivity and maintain the sanitary sewer and water infrastructure via innovative projects and a proactive approach to construction and maintenance.

Since 2012, Drive Fishers has completed traffic calming projects, sanitary and storm sewer projects, 33 resurfaced lane miles, 8 miles of trails and sidewalks, and received more than \$60 million in grants, improving the infrastructure in Fishers while leveraging federal dollars to save money for the Fishers' taxpayers.

Infrastructure improvement projects contribute to long-term vitality of our community and increased economic development opportunities.

PROJECT SCOPE

The 106th Street Infrastructure Improvement Project consists of the installation of a new force main for the conveyance of wastewater on 106th Street from the I-69 interchange to the Cheeney Creek Wastewater Treatment Facility on Eller Road, along with road and drainage improvements along 106th Street and Eller Road. The nature of the project requires periods of road closures, which will be phased throughout the project allowing for continuous access for local traffic and full road closures of sections of 106th Street on a rolling basis for thru-traffic during the project.

Please note: all estimated timelines and project phases are weather-dependent and subject to contractor scheduling. Project updates will be available on the Drive Fishers Twitter account and at fishers.in.us/106th. Caution and patience are both appreciated during the construction period.

PROJECT TIMELINE

December 2017 - January 2018

Lane Restrictions on Eller Road (DPW Facilities to Intersection of Eller Road and 106th Street). Access to local neighborhoods maintained.

January 2018 - February 2018

During this phase, the intersection of Eller Road and 106th Street will be closed. Access to properties abutting 106th Street will be maintained. Eller Run neighborhood will not have access to 106th Street. Eller Run neighborhood access will be available from Eller Road. The temporary entrance to Heritage Park will be in use at this time. 106th Street from Eller Road to Allisonville Road will be closed to thru-traffic.

February 2018 - March/April 2018

106th Street from Allisonville Road to Hague Road will be closed to thru-traffic. Access to properties abutting 106th Street will be maintained. Northfield Estates neighborhood will have access from Hague Road and Allisonville Road. Northfield Estates neighborhood will not have access to 106th Street.

106th Street from Hague Road to the west side of Lantern Road roundabout will be closed to thru-traffic. Access to properties abutting 106th Street will be maintained. Berkley Grove and Lantern Pointe neighborhoods will not have access to 106th Street. Lantern Pointe neighborhood will access from Lantern Road. Berkley Grove neighborhood will have access available from Hague Road.

April 2018 - May 2018

Spot closures in place at the intersection of Eller Road and 106th Street, 106th Street west of Allisonville Road, and on 106th Street west of Hague Road to make interconnections to the force main. Temporary entrance to Heritage Park will be in place for a two to three week period.

August 2018 - October 2018

Eller Road reopens. 106th Street from Eller Road to Allisonville Road is closed to through traffic for force main installation and drainage and road improvements, as well as from Allisonville Road to Hague Road. 106th Street from Hague Road to the Lantern/Crosspoint roundabout is also closed to through traffic for force main installation and drainage and road improvements.

October 2018 - November 2018

Lane restrictions will occur on 106th Street from Eller Road to Allisonville Road, from Allisonville Road to Hague Road, and from Hague Road to the Lantern/Crosspoint roundabout for asphalt paving.

The 106th Street Infrastructure Improvement Project is weather-dependent. Anticipated construction phases and timelines are subject to change as the project progresses. Ongoing updates about this project will be shared via the Drive Fishers [Twitter](#) account and on weekly road notice emails.
